If Tyson keeps the football, it would be the wrong thing to do because it would be taking something that did not belong to him.




Because Tyson kept the football, he was given time out and was not allowed to play with his classmates.


Taking something that does not belong to you is called stealing. Stealing is a crime and is the wrong thing to do.

No, stealing is not a crime




Yes, stealing is a crime





If you choose **YeS**, it is the right answer.




QUESTION:
